# 1.4.2 – How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

#### Feedback Obtained

The feedback mechanism is rigorously implemented by the institution to know the positives and negatives of the system for wellbeing of the institution and thereby the stakeholders. The college has developed multilayered feedback mechanism such as • Feedback on syllabi from all the stakeholders • Feedback collected from students during students satisfaction survey. • Feedback from

teachers, academicians and administrators participating during the events organized viz. Seminars, Conferences and Workshops etc by the college. • Feedback is also collected from parents during the meet of Parents Teachers Association. • Feedback is also sought from the alumni during Alumni Meet, Activities and Interactions with the institution organized by the Alumni Association. • Suggestion boxes are kept at the main entrance of all educational wings to collect suggestions from the students. After analysis of the feedback received from the stakeholders it is observed that there are some suggestions regarding modifications in existing curricula. Considering this the institution sent a request letter to the registrar of the affiliating university to make necessary changes as has been suggested. Doing this could have become possible as most of the faculty members of the institution have been representing various authorities of the university such as board of Studies and Academic Council. These suggestions get converted into practice and becomes beneficial not only to the institution but for the institutions affiliated to the university. The suggestions obtained from all stakeholders, after due analysis are utilized not only for institutional wellbeing but the wellbeing of all stakeholders also. The most valuable suggestions are placed before the college development committee (CDC). The college Development committee takes appropriate decisions on the basis of such decisions the CDC has resolved to 1. To increase ICT facilities including campus Wi Fi. 2. Sanitary Vending Machine and the disposal systems are deployed in Girls Common Rooms ( Department of Cosmetics Technology and the Self Financing wing) 3. The management has introduced appropriate changes in the organization of GEMS activities such as, Sports Carnival, Trade Fair etc. 4. Book issue facility is also made available for the parents. 5. Seating Capacity is increased in Vidya Niketan Study Centre, the facility centre for the students preparing for competitive examinations. 6. Library hours are extended. 7. 2.3.2 - Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

Yes! The college has a robust and vibrant mentoring system in the form of Tutor Ward Cell to deal with academic

and stress related issues of the learners. The college has instituted the Tutor Ward scheme a long ago for a better and effective mentor mentee rapport. The Tutor Ward Cell is fully functional to monitor and look after mentoring of the learners. The functions of this cell involve filling, collecting and distributing of the forms filled by the students, followed by observing the regular contacts and visits of the tutors to the houses of the Wards allotted to them at least twice in an academic year. In the opening of each academic year, the Wards are classified and allotted to the mentors class wise. Schedules of the visits along with the contact numbers and addresses of the mentee are handed over to the mentor concerned. Thereafter, visits are paid and interactions are carried out, observations are recorded and reports thereon mentor wise are submitted to the convener of the cell. The cell also organizes Parent Teacher meetings as and when required to discuss the overall development of their Wards. Each year the students of under graduate courses, after the admission, fill in a form and get enrolled with the Tutor Ward cell. The filled in forms are collected by the Tutor Ward committee, followed by their distribution faculty wise and finally subject wise. Each teaching member acts as a 'Tutor/Mentor', whom a group of students probably consisting of 10 15, is allotted. The tutors look after the students throughout the year and maintain a good rapport with them as well as with their family. In an academic year, the tutor visits twice to the houses of the Wards allotted or makes frequent contacts with student's family through telephonic talk or by some other means. The teachers maintain a separate record of tutor ward. In 2018 19, the Parent Teacher meetings were accomplished on 29/09/2018(BBA program), 06/10/2018 (BCA program) and 07/10/2018 (Science, Arts and Commerce courses). Due to tutor ward scheme, it has been observed that students develop a good relation with the teacher, in turn affinity and affection with the college, also. The tutor ward scheme enhances interaction with the students and their families. Therefore, the students share their concerns, doubts and problems with the tutor. In short, the mentors govern the Wards' performance, achievements and holistic development of his/her personality. The Tutor Ward Cell has become successful in achieving its goals as the attendance of the Wards seem to be increased, their interactions appeared to be geared up, their participation in games, sports and co curricular activities have go augmented and lastly their academic performance seems to have enhanced.

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2.5.2 - Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

The college has established the Examination Committee to monitor smooth conduct of University Examinations and continuous internal evaluation at institutional level. The college follows standard procedure prescribed by the affiliating university to conduct the continuous internal evaluation of the learners. Semester pattern is being followed as per the university policy at UG and PG level, which ensures continuous internal evaluation. Faculty members use modern methods like Google Classroom not only to inform students but also to conduct unit tests, etc., for a better continuous internal evaluation of learners. The schedule for Units Tests, Assignments, and other co curricular activities for internal evaluation are given wide publicity through Prospectus and notices, as and when required, as well as through oral information, prior to unit tests. All the activities related to continuous internal evaluation are conducted as per the given schedule. The learner's performance in unit tests is conveyed, displayed and discussed with the stakeholders, if required. Some departments conduct additional activities like Revision Practicals, Mock Viva voce, in house projects, and other appropriate activities to increase confidence of students and hone their skills. The students, especially advanced learners, are engaged in group discussions, quiz competitions, elocutions, debates and other co curricular activities. Departments like Computer Application, Management Studies give high importance to case studies, whilst departments like Botany and Zoology organized field visits as a part of continuous evaluation of the learners. Before university examinations, for Practical of UG and PG, external examiners are appointed to assess their factual performance.

2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

The college has established an Academic and Administrative Audit Committee to prepare Academic Calendar and monitor its execution. The college being an affiliated institution is adhered to the academic calendar approved and verbalized by the affiliating university while preparing the Academic Calendar of the college. Before the commencement of any academic session, the 'Academic and Administrative Audit Committee' prepares and finalizes the academic calendar in consultation with various stakeholders. The committee monitors the wide spread publicity of academic calendar. The academic calendar is included in the college prospectus and the institutional web site to give wide publicity. The academic calendar is circulated among the college staff also so that various activities like Unit Tests, Assignments, etc. mentioned in academic calendar are followed. The changes, if any, in academic calendar are conveyed to all the stake holders. The college has established an Examination Committee to monitor the smooth conduct of University Examinations and continuous internal evaluation at institutional level. The college follows the standard procedure prescribed by the affiliating university to conduct the theory and practical examinations. Date, time, question papers and answer sheets are provided by the affiliating University, only. The evaluation of the answer books is made under the central assessment program in the university premises itself, and the teachers of the college share their part in the evaluation process. Results are declared by the affiliating university. The college conducted home examination for entry year under the semester pattern in 2018 19, and it was conducted on trial basis.

4.4.2 – Procedures and policies for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc. (maximum 500 words) (information to be available in institutional Website, provide link)

The Institution believes in the philosophy of optimum utilization of academic and support facilities. Therefore it has a predefined procedures and policies for its maintenance as well as utilization. As far as procedures are concerned, the Institution has a code of conduct for the academic and support staff. The support staff is regulated at two levels under the concerned head of the Departments and the security incharge of the campus. The head of the department assigns responsibilities to the laboratory staff. It involves monitoring and regulating cleanliness, vigilance and maintenance of the equipments. The security incharge looks after maintenance of the campus including parking lots, campus roads, garden, building corridors and cafeteria. Sweepers and cleaners are hired on adhoc basis to maintain the sanitary units. The indoor and outdoor sports facilities including yoga and meditation centre are maintained by the Director of Physical Education. For effective maintenance of the resources available in sports complex, certain services are hired by appointing external experts including Badminton, Gym and Cricket. To maintain the turf on the playfield mowing machines have been purchased. Internal pipeline is laid down with dripping and sprinkling facilities. Playfield is maintained by a special caretaker. The Institution has two women's' hostels. The hostel superintendent along with support staff maintains hostel facilities. In order to regulate boarding related issues a students' committee is formed. It is headed by a prefect. The food facilities are available in the hostel. The mess is run on no loss no profit policy. The librarian, in consultation with library advisory committee looks after the maintenance and functioning of library. As a part of vigilance and security of resources certain measures have been adopted. In order to prevent any untoward incident, windows are covered with net and surveillance cameras. The library treasure is protected with anti termite treatment. Naphthalene balls are kept in every stack to protect the books. Fire extinguishers are also installed. At the end of every academic year, stock verification is carried out by stock checking committee. The committee

scrutinizes physical verification of stack, books and the instruments available in library, laboratory and office. The breakages are sorted out if the equipments are repairable then they are forwarded to the concerned agency/mechanics. The irrepairable are suggested to right off from the stock book. The stock checking committee submits the report to the Principal. To access eresources and to protect the data in safe, every year software of antivirus are periodically installed. Two faculties have been appointed for the maintenance of IT infrastructure. The Institution believes in the policy of minimum outsourcing and self sustenance of infrastructure. Therefore, in institutional campus we have inhouse Industrial Training Centre (ITC). The furniture, fixture, and electricity are maintained by ITC unit. The Institution is self reliant for electricity requirement. It is generated through solar panels. The water requirement is fulfilled by the old well available in the campus. Rain water harvesting unit is developed nearby the well to maintain the water table in the campus.

6.1.1 – Mention two practices of decentralization and participative management during the last year (maximum 500 words)

Decentralization: Governing body of Institute exercises general supervision and control of affairs of the college. It formulates the strategic policy decisions in interest of faculty and students. For proper deployment and execution purpose a core committee named CDC (College Development Committee) is formed in which heads of various departments are members. It acts as a link between Management and college. Meetings of CDC are held regularly to discuss matters related to college development, students and faculty development. The college has a purchase committee, which looks after the decision of purchases and upgrading of infrastructure in which every faculty members as well as heads of various departments are involved. Regular meetings are held with governing body and principal where the committee proposes the budget for purchase of equipment, library books and other allied items for each programme. List of all items as decided by HODs are put forward regarding the structural changes and other necessary equipment to purchase committee for approval. Quotations are taken from different dealers and comparative charts are made by the convener of purchase committee and the same is forwarded to Principal. The principal forwards this to Management. After the approval the purchase/subscription is done by the purchase committee . It verifies the acquired list of items and forwards the bill to office account staff for settlement. In this way, the college has a practice of all decisions originating from the lower level bodies and their screening and evaluation by higher level bodies thus manifesting principles of decentralization of authority. Participative Management: The culture of participative management is achieved through the committees operating at strategic level (GB, CDC and Principal), Functional level (HODs) and operational (Faculty and students) levels of management. The college has come up with separate wing to deal with cultural, games and sports under the umbrella of GEMS (General event management society) for planning and executing many operational procedures in the institution. Stakeholders at all levels have an opportunity to contribute his/her innovative ideas leading towards

achievement of excellence. The committee initiates by planning annual calendar of events. Here students are regulating all activities. Such ambiance is created where students come forward with innovative ideas. The first flagship program of G.E.M.S. is "Vidya Bharati Trade fair". The planning started with the promotion of the idea and distribution of the forms to students interested in putting up a stall. # Percentage of power requirement of the University met by the renewable energy sources

The institution has paid special attention to environmental issues and sustainability. Due cares have been taken to keep the campus pollution free and every possible measures are taken to sustain the biodiversity in the campus. As

far as energy requirement is concerned, the institution has installed roof top solar power generation plant on the top of the Main Building and Pratibha Women's Hostel in the campus. The total Annual Power requirement is 164836 KWH. By installing Solar Power Plant, the institution has become self sufficient in regards to electricity. It generates renewable energy 122500 KWH throughout the year. These figures indicate that we are dependent only for 42336 KWH. In percentage as far as energy requirement is concerned, we are self sufficient to the maximum extent. Besides, we have installed LED Bulbs throughout the campus in and out by which we are saving around 50 Percent of annual power.

have had a devastating impact on ecosystem. Man has proven a threat to nature.
From exploitation of nature to the pollution created environment is the evil of
 man. The Green initiatives have become the need of the day. Sustainable and
 ecofriendly practices are of utmost importance. These strategies need to be
    incorporated into the institutional planning to keep a clean and green
environment in the campus. Robust action is needed to combat increasing rate of
environmental damage to water sources, land air which affect the biodiversity.

The core committee sits and prepares the Perspective Plan for the ensuing year. The members are free to share their views in the meeting. After due discussion the plan gets final shape and thereafter it is sent to the management to approve it. To streamline the activities and for better governance the core committee classifies events under different clubs Club Sadhana - Holistic and spiritual development Club Manthan - Personality and skill development Club Young Minds -Oratory, elocution and innovation. Club Malhaar - Arts, Music and Drama Club Shourya - Sports and physical development. Club Enviro - Environmental awareness and development The events like tree plantation drive, rain water harvesting, paper bag making, hands on training, Ganpati idol making, clay modelling, patriotic song competition, visits to the NGOs, elocution competition, trade fair to instil entrepreneurial skills, seminar on cyber crime, teachers' day celebration, workshop on personality development, expert talk on concentration and confidence building, workshop on ewaste management, talk on plastic hazards, Yoga day celebration and workshops on folk dance, drama, skit, mime, acting and theatre folk, orchestra, western song, rangoli making, spot painting and poster making, birth and death anniversaries of the national heroes etc. are organised under the forum. Thus they learn to work as a team, importance of cooperation and handling of human resources which otherwise would not have been possible in the class rooms. The sample event is described here Trade Fair a

step towards enhancing entrepreneurial skills. The students learn selling strategies, analysed profit and loss, handling of the customers, availability of raw material, etc. They pick up the stalls under the heads of Food, Games and Artefacts/handicrafts. Coupons are sold well in advance. Thus the students learn the management skills like planning and organising, along with distribution of responsibilities, participative learning, and necessity of transparency in work.
